

The Lake House of Úlfljótsvatn is an old farmhouse situated on the shores of the lake Úlfljótsvatn that offers short-term accommodation in the winter time. It is only a 20 minutes drive from Selfoss. The land it sits on is co-owned with the Icelandic Boys & Girls Scout Association and the Reykjavík Scout Association. It is mostly dedicated to carbon sequestration tree plantations and scouting outdoor activities in the summer.

This three-story house can accommodate families, couples and individual travelers. The house has an open kitchen for cooking, two modern bathrooms to share, and a cosy living-room with beautiful views of the mountain Búrfell, the picturesque church of Úlfljótsvatn, and the lake. The absence of city lights makes it a perfect spot to observe northern lights. It is overall an ideal location for escaping the city and enjoying the beauty and silence of the Icelandic nature.

It is an excellent stay-over location to drive the Golden Circle with close access to: the crater Kerið, the Viking parliament of Þingvellir and its national park, Geysir, Gullfoss waterfall, as well as many woodlands and forests.
